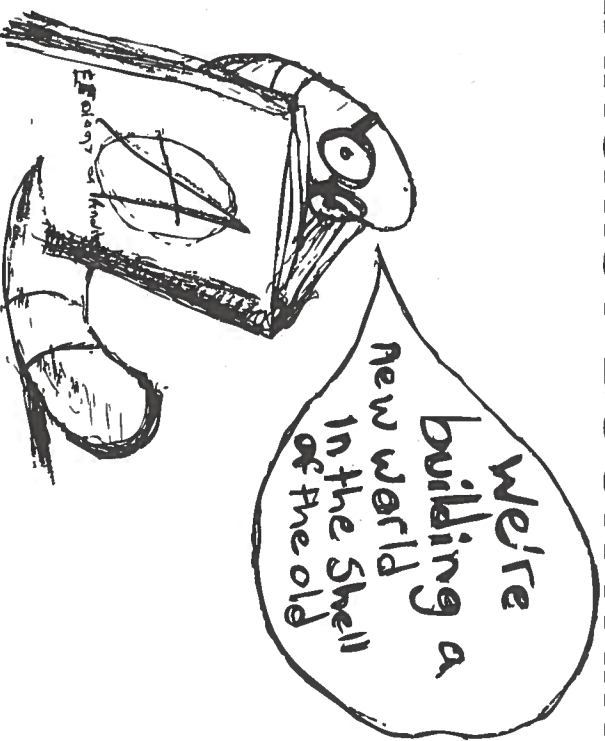

Greetings From Humboldt Grassroots: Issue Number 4.

Though we've taken a beating, we're still pursuing those doing the mistreating! We continue to cultivate grassroots power. For those who are new to our movement, Grassroots represents self-organization, solidarity and cooperation in promoting a strong communal pool of social support. Our aim is to fulfill goals with a growing community of people who are struggling against a Capitalist hierarchy, protected by the growing authority of a police state. One of our services to our community is the annual Humboldt Anarchist Book Fair, the 4th one was held in December 2011.

It is awesome to recall that there were over 800 people in attendance at the 4th Humboldt Anarchist Book Fair. Many were first-time participants, indicating the increasing number of individuals seeking information in response to social injustice. While national unrest pervades the lives of those, not in the privileged ranks of our tiered social system, Humboldt County certainly has had its share of abuse from the upper echelons. On November 14 2011, Andrew Harner, one of the editors of Humboldt Grassroots, was engaged in a protest in front of the Humboldt County courthouse in Eureka when he was savagely beaten, for a full minute, on the back of his head, by Eureka Police officer Terry Liles. After being knocked unconscious he was treated at a nearby hospital for traumatic brain injury. Due to Andrew's medical condition and the continued police harassment toward others, in the editorial collective, (wrongful arrests), the fourth edition of Humboldt Grassroots has been delayed.

Additionally, a license plate, recorded at a September rally outside the Walmart site, resulted in a police command post surrounding the residence of a Humboldt Grassroots organizer, further hampering measures toward timely publication, and effective action. These intrusive measures by local police, while causing interruptions to our channel of communication with our readers, only underscore the necessity for a written chronicle of injustice within Humboldt County. So, while we did, indeed, have prior knowledge of the invasive arrival of Walmart, seven months before it opened, we were much too under-staffed, at that time, to support a campaign preventing the Walmart infestation of our community. As the police use brute force to depose our cause, we at Humboldt Grassroots have found that their rampaging has attracted much attention, both locally and regionally. The outcome of their ill-conceived bullying: Showing the system for what it is, and underscoring the need to build a capable resistance movement to put an end to this oppressive system and create a free and equitable society.

In the mean time, the *Rhizome Info-Shop has opened at 47 West 3rd Street, near Commercial. Hours of operation will be posted on our website. Although Monday through Thursday from 2pm-8pm is usually a good bet, someone will be staffing the space. This space has become a space to facilitate communication, education and organization. We now have a venue in Eureka where we can meet one another, share information, read books, watch movies and build community, all in a positive, enjoyable environment. The Rhizome is there for the community, please come use it.

*The Rhizome is essentially the anatomical part of the plant where the roots meet. We chose this metaphor carefully.
